And when I say that, I mean those who have a language barrier. 10 00:01:00,500 --> 00:01:03,890 There's a lot of immigrants in our community that do not speak the language.

11 00:01:03,890 --> 00:01:13,310 There's a lot of immigrants in the community that do not even understand the policies, the procedures, the small little laws that take into place. 12 00:01:13,310 --> 00:01:20,310 And that's why we are here, to serve our community and to give them the benefit that they truly deserve. 13 00:01:20,310 --> 00:01:25,040 (Interviewer) What is the most rewarding part of your work? 14 00:01:25,040 --> 00:01:32,840 (Akram Salman) I really can't just choose one rewarding part of my position or the work that we do, an Arab-American Family Services, 15 00:01:32,840 --> 00:01:42,560 every day that I get to serve the community is actually very rewarding when a family comes in and it's whether it's a refugee family, 16 00:01:42,560 --> 00:01:47,240 an immigrant family or even a family who was born here in the United States. 17 00:01:47,240 --> 00:01:53,330 And they do not know what they qualify for in terms of services or in terms of benefits. 18 00:01:53,330 --> 00:01:57,590 And they walk out with an abundance of resources, 19 00:01:57,590 --> 00:02:03,140 having just come in with one question and they've walked out with something that could set them for life. 20 00:02:03,140 --> 00:02:08,960 That's very rewarding. And if you want me, I can hone in on an

example. 21 00:02:08,960 --> 00:02:16,700 If a refugee comes in and they don't understand that, they do qualify for something as simple as financial assistance, 22 00:02:16,700 --> 00:02:23,810 rental assistance or SNAP benefits because they do worry about where their next meal is going to come from, 23 00:02:23,810 --> 00:02:28,070 how they will help their children eat or be a part of the community. 24 00:02:28,070 --> 00:02:33,020 When I know I had a hand in helping them achieve that, it's very rewarding. 25 00:02:33,020 --> 00:02:37,490 And I'm so lucky and humble to do that on a daily basis. 26 00:02:37,490 --> 00:02:42,650 It brings so much joy to families knowing that they have someone in the community who can speak their 27 00:02:42,650 --> 00:02:47,810 language and understand their cultural background and understand the barriers that they're going through, 28 00:02:47,810 --> 00:02:56,540 whether it's it's the barriers of having non-legal status or barriers of not understanding the culture shock, barriers 29 00:02:56,540 --> 00:03:06,290 of not speaking the language or even filling out a simple application where they do not find Arab-American or even Middle Eastern on an application. 30 00:03:06,290 --> 00:03:13,890 I am there to quide them through the process and let them know you do exist. We are here to assist you and we are here to help you.

31 00:03:13,890 --> 00:03:18,470 (Interviewer) What makes the work of your organization unique? 32 00:03:18,470 --> 00:03:27,380 (Akram Salman) We are all bilingual caseworkers, we are all bilingual advocates, and like I mentioned before, we do understand the cultural background. 33 00:03:27,380 --> 00:03:34,430 We do understand the ethnic needs of our community, no matter what area or what background they come from. 34 00:03:34,430 --> 00:03:45,450 We are so diverse and inclusive in Arab-American family services that we are so ready and easily adapt to the changes that happen on a daily basis. 35 00:03:45,450 --> 00:03:51,380 So we are there to provide and we do understand the ethnic background that they come from and the 36 00:03:51,380 --> 00:03:56,850 special attention that they need due to the lack of resources from whatever area they are coming from. 37 00:03:56,850 --> 00:04:04,370 We are there to assist, no matter what kind of services they come in looking for. 38 00:04:04,370 --> 00:04:08,330 (Interviewer) With the challenges presented by covid-19 regarding service delivery, 39 00:04:08,330 --> 00:04:17,730 how do you feel your organization has responded in terms of supporting its immigrant and refugee communities? 40 00:04:17,730 --> 00:04:30,120

(Akram Salman) Responded very well, even when the state came down to where there was a stay at home order to us, that meant let's kick it into higher gear. 41 00:04:30,120 --> 00:04:39,030 We hit the ground running the next day. I remember the next day there was a congregate meal that was supposed to be delivered to the elderly. 42 00:04:39,030 --> 00:04:48,210 And COVID did not set us back, not even one bit. We were ready to still serve our community despite covid throwing a wrench in 43 00:04:48,210 --> 00:04:53,730 our way and trying to hinder us from serving our Valeyard community members. 44 00:04:53,730 --> 00:04:58,440 We hit the ground running the next day. We are all out there serving meals to the community, 45 00:04:58,440 --> 00:05:07,230 serving meals to the elderly just so that they do not feel the pressure or the barriers of what this pandemic has really put us through. 46 00:05:07,230 --> 00:05:17,700 I also believe that working from home has made us reach out to our community members in a way that they never thought was even possible. 47 00:05:17,700 --> 00:05:23,550 We were we were available to them whenever they needed to talk to someone or whenever 48 00:05:23,550 --> 00:05:27,960 they needed to ask about their application process or an update on their status. 49 00:05:27,960 --> 00:05:36,750 We were readily available to them. And our clients were very thankful that COVID did not set us back one bit.

50 00:05:36,750 --> 00:05:45,660 There are so many people who are worried about their financial status during COVID we were able to help them apply for rental assistance. 51 00:05:45,660 --> 00:05:51,300 We were able to apply to help them apply for emergency financial assistance just to be that 52 00:05:51,300 --> 00:06:00,480 kind of beam of hope or a glimmer of hope in such a pandemic that really scared everybody, 53 00:06:00,480 --> 00:06:07,260 confused everybody, especially those who don't speak the language, who really don't know what's going on. 54 00:06:07,260 --> 00:06:12,480 You know, the immigrants and the refugees that have just arrived to this country and all of a sudden COVID hit. 55 00:06:12,480 --> 00:06:18,120 It's it really did. It threw them back a little bit. 56 00:06:18,120 --> 00:06:22,210 It confused them. It scared them. It made them worry. 57 00:06:22,210 --> 00:06:26,940 It made them feel like they had no one to turn to. And just for Arab-American Family Services, 58 00:06:26,940 --> 00:06:34,320 with all the outreach that we have done with all the social media outreach that we have done with our everyday being part of the community, 59 00:06:34,320 --> 00:06:37,470 physically being part of the community outside the offices,

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00:06:37,470 --> 00:06:43,320 letting people know although the office is physically closed, we are still here to assist you. 61 00:06:43,320 --> 00:06:51,570 We are still here to help you. We're more than willing to to reach out to you in any way that we possibly can. 62 00:06:51,570 --> 00:06:57,450 You know, we never stopped working. So, I mean, just if anything, 63 00:06:57,450 --> 00:07:06,000 COVID really made us connect with the community on a much stronger level and let them know that we can reach out to you through social media. 64 00:07:06,000 --> 00:07:12,450 We can reach out to you through Zoom meetings. We can reach out to you through emails, through text messages. 65 00:07:12,450 --> 00:07:15,690 We did not lose contact with any of our community members anything. 66 00:07:15,690 --> 00:07:25,260 We gained so many more community members who tried to reach out to Arab-American Family Services because they saw the work that we do on social media. 67 00:07:25,260 --> 00:07:31,110 And then it just made them feel like they were finally part of a community who's willing to 68 00:07:31,110 --> 00:07:36,240 understand where they're coming from and who's willing to understand their ethnic challenges. 69 00:07:36,240 --> 00:07:39,990 And unfortunately, being someone from an immigrant community, 70 00:07:39,990 --> 00:07:46,260

coming from an immigrant background or a refugee background makes people feel like they are less than. 71 00:07:46,260 --> 00:07:48,750 And they make it's unfortunately, 72 00:07:48,750 --> 00:07:55,800 there's a lot of agencies out there that do not have the same experience that we do at Arab-American Family Services. 73 00:07:55,800 --> 00:08:00,240 They do not have the same service skill that we do an Arab-American Family Services. 74 00:08:00,240 --> 00:08:04,680 We pride ourselves on being able to connect with the clients on a different level, 75 00:08:04,680 --> 00:08:08,550 and that's being able to help them feel like they are right at home. 76 00:08:08,550 --> 00:08:11,310 They did not skip a beat. There is nothing missing. 77 00:08:11,310 --> 00:08:21,690 We are there every step of the way from Challenge A until they graduate beyond challenge C. 78 00:08:21,690 --> 00:08:26,880 (Interviewer) Please share an overview of the immigrant and refugee communities you serve. 79 00:08:26,880 --> 00:08:32,310 (Akram Salman) What I would really like to highlight is all of the communities that we serve and we serve the immigrant community, 80 00:08:32,310 --> 00:08:36,240 we serve the refugee community, we service low income communities.

81 00:08:36,240 --> 00:08:43,450 We service all minority communities. That does not mean we do not include everybody is as diverse as we are. 82 00:08:43,450 --> 00:08:50,880 We like to pride ourselves on inclusivity as well. There's a lot of people that talk about diversity, but there is no inclusivity. 83 00:08:50,880 --> 00:08:53,070 A bonus with Arab-American Family Services, 84 00:08:53,070 --> 00:08:59,160 is we include anybody and everybody who walks through the door or even picks up the phone and calls our office, 85 00:08:59,160 --> 00:09:05,520 sends us an email, sends us a Facebook message. We are there to service all of the communities around us. 86 00:09:05,520 --> 00:09:13,590 We are specifically based in the southwest suburbs of Chicago. But that does not mean we don't include all those who who reach out to us. 87 00:09:13,590 --> 00:09:14,790 And, you know, 88 00:09:14,790 --> 00:09:23,220 our what I what I really like to say is I'm very biased to the elderly community and the disabled community because I work so closely with them. 89 00:09:23,220 --> 00:09:28,830 And I feel like there are not a lot of laws that support the elderly or support the disabled community. 90 00:09:28,830 --> 00:09:32,100 And we are there to give them the assistance that they lack or the assistance

We are here to help you. 99 00:10:21,300 --> 00:10:33,194 And if a category on an application doesn't exist that you can connect with, we will create that category for you because you do deserve to be heard.
